- We will not take registrations at Open House until SSAC determines a structure for next school year with established tuition etc.

No one has stepped up to teach it the program so it has not been used. Sue was able to contact the company and they were willing to ignore the \$1200 invoice since the school has not used the program.
- Met with Lisa for possible numbers for tuition based on the survey with 21 students saying they would return next year. They counted non returned surveys as a 'no' so they could get a true figure. They did come up with an amount but do not want it in print until final word from the SSAC committee.
- Election of officers at the end of the month on January 25<sup>th</sup> including president and secretary for SB.
- SSAC date Monday January 24<sup>th</sup> at 1:00pm the SB will be meeting with Dave from SSAC.
- School Board will meet with Lisa on February 7<sup>th</sup> to discuss findings with the school based on SSAC which will reported to Council on February 8<sup>th</sup>.

# Stewardship Notes - Al Oesterreich

## Celebrating Ministries

The Board of Stewardship will be celebrating various ministries of St. John during 2011. We will feature a ministry in both services on one of the Sundays of each month. The leader or spokesperson of the ministry will give a short presentation toward the end of the services. As congregation members we will learn about the mission, scope, activities, and needs of each ministry. We will also be able to see how we may want to become involved. The featured ministry for February will be Social Concerns.

## Report of Offerings

- Total general offerings for December: \$26,704
- Estimated total general offerings needed for December: \$30,340
- December offerings for the Board of Social Concerns' response to the Janet May House Fire: \$1,600
- December memorial donations: \$50
- December building donations: \$63
- December financial aid for school: \$105
- Total general offerings for July 1 – December 31: \$155,302
- Estimated total general offerings needed for July 1 – December 31: \$163,836
- Estimated total general offerings needed for February: \$25,584

Offerings for the first half of the fiscal year (July 1, 2010 – December 31, 2010) are \$8,534 (5.2%) less than the estimated need and \$2,927 (1.8%) less than the first half of last fiscal year. The Board of Stewardship is very thankful for the offerings received, especially when we see that the level of giving per member has increased. We are concerned, however, that our giving is still slightly less than the estimated need. In order to make up the difference the estimated monthly need for general offerings for the remainder of the fiscal year is \$25,584 for 4-Sunday months and \$31,980 for 5-Sunday months.

## Our Ministry of Evangelism

Evangelism was our featured ministry for the month of January. We learned of the various contributions of that ministry to life at St. John. Did you see a way in which you would like to serve? If you did, please let Dave Rhan know that you are interested. May God continue to bless the work of evangelism at St. John.
