What good news! What hope we have! I want to wish you a new year filled with God's best blessings! I want to encourage you to seek Him diligently in His Word and in prayer! He promises that when we seek Him with all of our heart, we will find Him! How good He is – all the time!

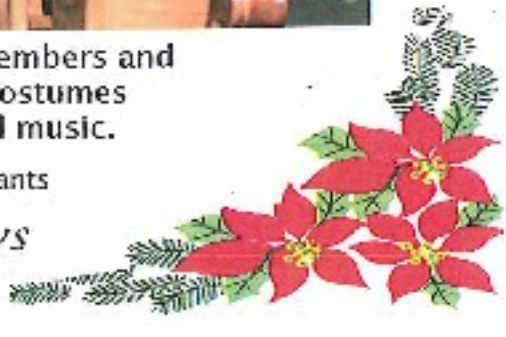

**Church Council Meeting (summarized)
December 14, 21010**

Meeting opened at 7:09 pm with devotions by Denise

Members Present: Mike Singley, Jerry Cook, Denise Wright, Eric Gunnet, Dave Rhan, Lisa Schreiber, Walt Jeffers, Sue Burwick, Diane Imler and Jen Harlacher

Boards requiring action: Elders and Social Concerns

Elders:

- Presenting a motion to Council to permanently install a projector screen in the sanctuary. The screen purchased for the fellowship hall may be better suited to use in the sanctuary. There has been discussion in Elders for the past 2 years in regards to installing a screen to enhance worship. This will need to be presented and approved through Voter's. The screen may be used to show music lyrics, gospel lessons, and to assist with Pastor's message especially to create a more contemporary service at 11:00am. Motion to present installing screen at the next regular Voter's Meeting passed
- Two people have been added to the shut-in list.

Social Concerns:

- Proposing to develop a community outreach program through the Red Cross who is willing to coach Social Concerns. The outreach would collect gently used clothing and small home appliances and when there are victims who have suffered a life disaster etc. can come and pick out items of necessity. Diane has talked with Dawn to see if there is a side room off the school stage available for use. Council would like for Social Concerns to have a concrete plan including contact people who will assist with this program before bringing it to vote.
- Two members of the congregation whose house burned have received a total of \$800 in gift cards to date. She was extremely touched. The door offering this weekend generated \$700 with Thrivent providing a \$300 match.
- Provided a funeral meal.
- Holiday Food Boxes-6 families
- Giving Tree
- Evangelism gave \$105 to pay for after school care for 3 school families in need.

Director of Spiritual Growth:

- Women's fellowship this Sunday 12/18/10
- Reinforced having time set aside to dedicate to the Word
- Continue to attend Sunday School-especially the leadership
- Marriage Weekend in February
- How can we reach our neighborhoods? We need to be hospitable and we can use the fellowship room in this area but we need to develop policies for use of this room. Sharing and helping is a way for us to reach out and develop their spiritual growth.

Finance:

- We were sent an invitation from the South East District on a conference for expense equalization programs for growth, equipping, fellowship and learning. Deferring at this time.
- We have gotten past some difficult times and have built up some small funds including that we have been paying accepted share. All committees have been maintaining their expenses.
- Roberto Rivera's father in law graciously looked at the roof and is going to present us with options and a rough estimate what the cost of repair would be for each option.
- There will be a financial shortfall in the school this fiscal year and all contingencies will be used up. Finance has met with school board and they are to meet in February to determine what will happen next year.

SSAC:

- "Noah's Arc committee"-Lisa, Walt, Bud, Jerry, Adelaide Ward, Mark Chidester, Nancy Kilgore, Kathy Weiss, Samantha Webb, Amy Walton, Connie Reed, and Pastor comprise this committee.
- Discussed an aggressive calendar. February 1st was set as a target to get us going. School Board has 2 open houses in January. Concern was raised that the school would not have the necessary information for tuition prices and available grades for the open houses as well as concern with rearranging dates already set for deadlines given by SSAC. Much discussion ensued about moving the deadline to March.

Open houses are currently set for January 23rd and February 6th. Parent meetings are set for January 10th and 13th to present to them several available options and obtain their feedback to determine which package and grades they could feasibly offer. Conclusion made to go forward with the established dates and to follow the suggestion that SSAC gave us as best as we can do put forth a good faith effort in order to obtain the results and changes we need despite the possibility of change. There have been many people that have put in countless time and effort to make this successful.

- Meeting with School Board and Finance to occur on February 8th before Council and then plan to set a special Voter's Meeting for the end of February.
- Sally Hiller stated we need to figure the cost to educate a student with the given of having 20 kids per 1 teacher.
- Walt, Bud and Lisa are going to meet to determine cost per pupil
- SSAC committee will meet January 5th to gather information to work out various scenarios to give the parents.
- January 10th and 13th we will present options to the parents to get a feel for their level of commitment based on the scenarios.
- SSAC meeting cancelled this week due to inclement weather hoping to reschedule with SSAC in the beginning of January.

Evangelism:

- Discussed with Margaret Winemiller how to subsidize Carry Out to Campus. The boxes were very costly to ship so she has been sending gift cards. Dave helping to umbrella Carry Out to Campus under Evangelism.

Fellowship:

- They have had people volunteer to prepare soup and bread for the Advent dinners.
- Looking to plan a strictly social event in March to get to know each other.

Stewardship

- Stewardship would like to highlight each ministry within the church to inform members of ways they can become involved.
- They have had some feedback on the survey forms. Some people have stated that they would have signed up but "I did not know what the words meant" or I have signed up but I haven't been called. Discussed describing the committees and projects on the handouts. The ministry highlights proposed by Stewardship will help to clear those issues.

School Board

- Appeal letter sent out.
- Survey sent to parents requesting their intentions for next year
- A tuition letter was sent to all school families reminding them they are suppose to pay by the 20th of the month. A total of 23 out of 36 school families have not been paying on time. An incentive was given to be entered for a drawing for two free tickets to Avalanche Express for those families that have paid on time.
- Meeting with Mrs. Hennig to discuss the before and after school program and the new prepay program to eliminate the deficit that has occurred in the past. There was a note in the Herald that stated there was day care available during the week of December 20th for \$20 per 10 ½ hour day or \$10 for half day. The current rate for before/after school care is \$3.50 per hour. Sharon has used the above rate for years however School Board has instructed her of the new rate which was approved previously and would need to be used for all future child care rendered.
- The old church computer was given to Dawn in the school office
- There haven't been a lot of back collections received to go back to the Development Fund.
- Current School Board members are Terry Hinckley, Sylvia Gibson, Ben Shellenberger, Amy Sindlinger, Nancy Kilgore, Kathy Weiss and Sue Burwick.
- Regular Voter's Meeting: January 23rd 2011.
- January 30th is the tentative date for the appreciation dinner for Tracey's 15 years of ministry at Hoss's.

President's Report

- Jerry thanked everyone for their service, support and commitment during the past 2 years he has served as Council President. Eric will be taking over in 2011.
- Pilates Exercise class being offered free of charge on the 3rd Monday of the month from 6:30-7:30pm.
