**50 plus! Bible Study.** Don't forget that the 50 plus! Bible Study is still in progress. We meet the first and third Thursday of each month at 10:30am. You are always welcome to join (even if you're a little under 50).

**Living in Solitary Confinement.** "I can worship the Lord alone, at home." As bad as their situation may be, prisoners fear solitary confinement. Are you living in solitary confinement? Have you separated yourself from the community of believers at St. John? Just like any group of human beings, you'll find self-centeredness and sin among the body of believers at St. John. But it still beats solitary confinement! The body of believers gathers together at St. John on a regular basis so that we may look to Christ as we support one another on our journey through this world. Yes, we are imperfect, but we manage to focus on Jesus and his grace and love for us. Can you do this in solitary confinement? Maybe, but not as well. Jesus gives us the gift of his Church to help us live, work, and learn together to strengthen our faith. Faith can die in solitary confinement and no one will be there to help. Unlike a prisoner, you can decide for yourself to end your solitary confinement. Come and re-join your "cellmates" this Sunday.

**"Maybe I'll Attend, but I Know My Husband Won't."** That's what I heard from a young mother who wished to have her baby Baptized. Husbands, where are you? Do you realize that your example of attending church will have permanent effects on the faith of your children and the closeness of



## November's DOOR OFFERING

LCMS World Relief acts in partnership with a number of other assistance organizations. Since 1945 LCMS World Relief has had an ongoing relationship with **Lutheran World Relief, Baltimore (LWR)**, primarily in responding to international emergencies and in offering self-help development grants in other countries. LCMS World Relief offers assistance to immigrants and refugees through **Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services**, also based in Baltimore. LCMS World Relief serves people in the United States with a variety of emergency and long-term human care needs through **Lutheran Services in America (LSA)**, an alliance of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, the Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod, and their social ministry organizations. LCMS World Relief also responds to emergencies in the U.S. through its partnership with inter-Lutheran agency **Lutheran Disaster Response**.

Today LCMS World Relief is a vibrant ministry of hope, "making a world of difference" in context of the Gospel. In recent years, the agency has enhanced its partnership with missionaries and partner churches. Domestic grants help U.S. congregations, social ministry organizations and LCMS districts begin or expand programs in training, housing, education, and refugee settlement.

## Stewardship Notes - Al Oesterreich

### Fall Stewardship Emphasis

“This service that you perform is not only supplying the needs of God's people but is also overflowing in many expressions of thanks to God This passage (2 Corinthians 9: 12) emphasizes the two major reasons for a life of stewardship. When we perform services in the household of faith, whether they be acts of kindness, praise, leadership, or enabling, we do something that is helpful. We actually build each other up and leave fertile soil for faith to grow. We also show our gratitude for God's abiding love for us, especially for our salvation which has been won by Jesus!

On the first three Sundays of November we will emphasize the many ways in which we can be God's stewards, or managers, of what He has provided. On Sunday, November 7<sup>th</sup> we will focus on how we manage our time. It's very easy for our lives to get so out of control that it seems that events are managing us. We need to reclaim our control so that we actually make decisions about the best use of the 24-hour days that we are given. There are many ways in which we can use those hours to build up our fellow saints.

Each of us has many talents – even more than we ourselves may realize. When we use these talents to glorify God and benefit others we manage them in a God-pleasing way. On November 14<sup>th</sup> we will be asked to consider our talents and the many opportunities for service at St. John. We will then be able to pledge acts of service for 2011.
